The College

Kennebec Valley Technical College, one of the seven colleges in the Maine Technical College System, is a commuter college located on a sixty-acre campus in central Maine.

KVTC was organized in 1969 by the 104th Maine Legislature and first classes began in the fall of 1970, with 35 full-time and 131 part-time students. Since then, KVTC has undergone many changes and has grown to an enrollment of 1,147 full and part-time students enrolled in credit courses for the Fall semester, 1999. In addition, non-credit enrollment and contract training enhance KVTC's enrollment by approximately 925 students.

The College is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc. and offers 22 full-time associate degree, diploma and certificate programs. In addition, KVTC offers a comprehensive schedule of continuing education courses and business and industry outreach programs.
